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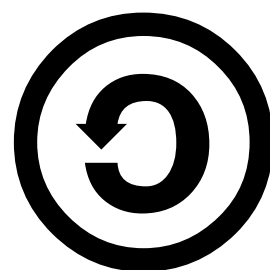
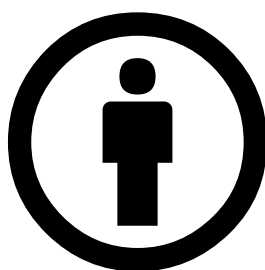
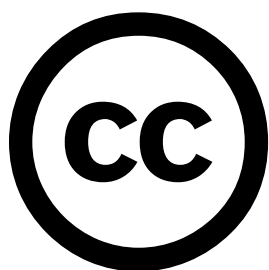
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PSALMS¹

Psalm 3 (RSV-CE)

O LORD, how many are my foes!

Many are rising against me;

there is no help for him in God.

how can you say to me,

what can the righteous do?”

Psalm 22[21] (RSV-CE)

In thee our fathers trusted;

Psalm 35[34] (RSV-CE)

Contend, O LORD, with those who contend with me;
fight against those who fight against me!
Take hold of shield and buckler,
and rise for my help!

against my pursuers!

“I am your deliverance!”

Let them be put to shame and dishonor
who seek after my life!
Let them be turned back and confounded
who devise evil against me!
Let them be like chaff before the wind,
with the angel of the LORD driving them on!
Let their way be dark and slippery,
with the angel of the LORD pursuing them!

For without cause they hid their net for me;
without cause they dug a pit for my life.
Let ruin come upon them unawares!
And let the net which they hid ensnare them;
let them fall therein to ruin!

Then my soul shall rejoice in the LORD,
exulting in his deliverance.
All my bones shall say,
“O LORD, who is like thee,
thou who deliverest the weak
from him who is too strong for him,

my soul is forlorn.
But I, when they were sick—
I wore sackcloth,

Then my tongue shall tell of thy righteousness
 and of thy praise all the day long.

Psalm 54[53] (RSV-CE)

Save me, O God, by thy name,
and vindicate me by thy might.
Hear my prayer, O God;

For insolent men have risen against me,
ruthless men seek my life;
they do not set God before them.

Behold, God is my helper;
the LORD is the upholder of my life.

Psalm 68[67] (RSV-CE)

Let God arise, let his enemies be scattered;
 let those who hate him flee before him!
As smoke is driven away, so drive them away;
 as wax melts before fire,
 let the wicked perish before God!

 let them be jubilant with joy!

Sing to God, sing praises to his name;

Father of the fatherless and protector of widows
 is God in his holy habitation.
God gives the desolate a home to dwell in;
 he leads out the prisoners to prosperity;

Psalm 91[90] (RSV-CE)

He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High,
who abides in the shadow of the Almighty,

and from the deadly pestilence;
he will cover you with his pinions,
and under his wings you will find refuge;

GOSPEL TEXTS¹

Saint Matthew 4:1–11 (RSV-CE)

Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. And he fasted forty days and forty nights, and afterward he was hungry. And the tempter came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." But he answered, "It is written,

‘Man shall not live by bread alone,

but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.’”

Then the devil took him to the holy city, and set him on the pinnacle of the temple, and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down; for it is written,

‘He will give his angels charge of you,’

and

‘On their hands they will bear you up,

lest you strike your foot against a stone.’”

Jesus said to him, "Again it is written, ‘You shall not tempt the Lord your God.’” Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain, and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and the glory of them; and he said to him, "All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me." Then Jesus said to him, "Begone, Satan! for it is written,

‘You shall worship the Lord your God

and him only shall you serve.’”

Then the devil left him, and behold, angels came and ministered to him.

Saint Mark 1:21-28 (RSV-CE)

And they went into Caper'na-um; and immediately on the sabbath he entered the synagogue and taught. And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes. And immediately there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit; and he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God." But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying with a loud voice, came out of him. And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching! With authority he commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." And at once his fame spread everywhere throughout all the surrounding region of Galilee.

Saint Mark 16:15-18 (RSV-CE)

And he said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to the whole creation. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned. And these signs will accompany those who believe: in my name they will cast out demons; they will speak in new tongues; they will pick up serpents, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not hurt them; they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover."

Saint Luke 10:17–20 (RSV-CE)

The seventy returned with joy, saying, “Lord, even the demons are subject to us in your name!” And he said to them, “I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Behold, I have given you authority to tread upon serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing shall hurt you. Nevertheless do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you; but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.”

Saint Luke 11:14–23 (RSV-CE)

Now he was casting out a demon that was dumb; when the demon had gone out, the dumb man spoke, and the people marveled. But some of them said, “He casts out demons by Be-el’zebul, the prince of demons”; while others, to test him, sought from him a sign from heaven. But he, knowing their thoughts, said to them, “Every kingdom divided against itself is laid waste, and house falls upon house. And if Satan also is divided against himself, how will his kingdom stand? For you say that I cast out demons by Be-el’zebul. And if I cast out demons by Be-el’zebul, by whom do your sons cast them out? Therefore they shall be your judges. But if it is by the finger of God that I cast out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. When a strong man, fully armed, guards his own palace, his goods are in peace; but when one stronger than he assails him and overcomes him, he takes away his armor in which he trusted, and divides his spoil. He who is not with me is against me, and he who does not gather with me scatters.”

Saint John 1:1–14 (RSV-CE)

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God; all things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness to the light.

The true light that enlightens every man was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world knew him not. He came to his own home, and his own people received him not. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God; who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father.
